Kitten Information Sheet

Core Vaccines:

FVRCP: Helps prevent a group of contagious and fatal diseases. The combo is given in a series of 3 doses at 4 week intervals. It is repeated in one year then every **2** years for remainder of your cat's life.

- 8 weeks
- 12 weeks
- 16 weeks

Rabies: This vaccine is given at **4** months of age and repeated the following year. Afterwards, it is repeated every **3** years for the remainder of your cat's life. This vaccine is required by law.

Non-core Vaccines:

FeLV: Helps prevent Feline Leukemia virus. The vaccine is given in a series of two doses 3-4 weeks apart. It is repeated every **2** years. A FeLV/TIV test is required prior to starting this vaccine for the first time.

Wellness care:

Annual Wellness exams

FeLV and FIV test: Feline Leukemia and Feline Immunodeficiency viruses are contagious and potentially fatal diseases. A blood test is recommended in kittens and young cats never screened previously.

Flea/Tick preventative: These parasites can cause discomfort and spread serious illnesses. Ask about the different safe and effective products available to suit you and your pets' lifestyle and needs.

Fecal: A fecal sample should be brought for kitten visits and yearly wellness exams. This checks for intestinal parasites.

Spay/Neuter: Recommended at 6 months of age.

Dental Care: We recommend a good at-home dental care routine along with professional dental cleanings to prevent periodontal disease in your pet. Start brushing your pet's teeth at a young age with pet appropriate toothpaste. There are also specially formulated treats and chews that help reduce formation of tartar.

Pet Insurance: Please ask our front staff on the various insurance carriers available.

Microchip: A permanent form of ID that aids in the recovery and return of your pet.
